The Aggie Ring

After graduation, Texas A&M School of Law graduates will turn their Aggie Rings so the class year faces away from the body, symbolizing a readiness to face the world with the power of the Aggie Network behind them.

The Lapel Pin

Each graduate will receive a Texas A&M School of Law lapel pin, which is exclusively given to and worn by law school graduates.

The Gonfalon

A widely accepted symbol of peace, the olive leaves highlight one of the most critical contributions of law and legal order to human development. Curving inwards, they also bring to mind the Aggie Ring - and the circle of fellowship and community it represents.

Lady Justice symbolizes the values our graduates bring to bear in their careers: a spirit of objectivity (blindfold), an unwavering commitment to fairness (scales), and the strength necessary to pursue it (sword).

The six stars, finally, represent Texas A&M's core values - Leadership, Respect, Loyalty, Excellence, Selfless Service, and Integrity - essential requirements of not only members of the legal profession, but all those who study the law and seek to advance justice, fairness, and the Rule of Law.

The Academic Hood

The academic hood has its origin in the tippet worn by begging friars in the Middle Ages. The colors of the hood lining correspond with the colors of the university conferring the degree. The purple color of the border represents the law discipline.

Excellence in Appellate Advocacy

This award honors the graduating law student who has demonstrated the most potential to excel in appellate advocacy.



Keynote Speaker

U.S. District Judge Karen Gren Scholer

The Honorable Karen Gren Scholer was sworn in as a United States District Judge for the Northern District of Texas on March 7, 2018, after being unanimously confirmed by the United States Senate 95-0. She has the distinct honor of being nominated to be an Article III judge by two different Administrations for two different Districts - by President Trump for the Northern District of Texas (Dallas) and by President Obama for the Eastern District of Texas (Plano). She is the first Asian American federal district judge in Texas and the entire Fifth Circuit.

Prior to her appointment to the federal trial bench, Judge Scholer was both a trial lawyer and state trial judge. She was elected as Judge of the 95th District Court of Texas for two terms, serving from 2001 to 2008. In private practice, Judge Scholer was co-managing and named partner at Carter Scholer (2014-18), and a litigation partner at Jones Day (2009-13), Andrews & Kurth (1996-2000), and Strasburger & Price (1982-96). Judge Scholer is a graduate of Rice University and Cornell University Law School.



Texas A&M System Representatives Chancellor John Sharp '72

Chancellor John Sharp '72 earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Texas A&M University, where he was a member of Squadron 6, the Corps staff of the Corps of Cadets, and the 1972 rugby team. He also was elected sophomore class president, student life chairman, Muster chairman, and student body president.

Upon graduation, Sharp was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the United States Army Reserve.

He later earned a master's in public administration from Texas State University. He is a distinguished alumnus from both universities.

Sharp served more than three decades as a state legislator, senator, railroad commissioner and comptroller before becoming a partner at Ryan & Company. He became Chancellor of The Texas A&M University System in 2011.

Sharp was married to Charlotte Sharp for 42 years before her passing in 2020. They have a daughter, Victoria; a son, Spencer; and two granddaughters, Simone and Freya.

Today Sharp is married to Diana Atchison Sharp, who has sons, Cas and Cullen; daughter Courtney Harvey; and grandchildren, Corr, Palmer, Annabel, Max and June.



W. Nim Kidd serves as the Chief of the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM). In this capacity, he is responsible for the state's emergency preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation activities. Prior to serving with TDEM, Chief Kidd was appointed to the San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD), where he was promoted through the ranks from firefighter to District Fire Chief, including Lieutenant in charge of the SAFD Technical Rescue Team and Captain of the SAFD Hazardous Materials Response Team.

From 2004 to 2010, Chief Kidd served as City Emergency Manager for the City of San Antonio, where he managed the city's response to over a dozen state and presidential disaster declarations. In 1997, Chief Kidd was one of the original members appointed to the Texas Task Force 1 Urban Search and Rescue Team. In 2001, he was the Plans Section Chief that responded to the 9/11 attack on the World Trade Center.

Chief Kidd formerly served as chair for the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) National Advisory Council (NAC). Chief Kidd holds a Master of Legal Studies from Texas A&M University, a Master of Public Administration from Texas State University, a bachelor's degree from Texas A&M University-Commerce, and two associate's degrees. He is the Vice Chancellor for Disaster and Emergency Services for The Texas A&M University System. He is a Certified Emergency Manager (CEM®), a Texas Master Firefighter, and holds Hazardous Materials and Emergency Medical Technician certifications. Chief Kidd and his wife, Dr. Emily Kidd, M.D., share three children and a beautiful granddaughter together.



Ken Robinson '93

Ken Robinson is a member of the Fightin' Texas Aggie Class of 1993. He holds a bachelor's degree in computer science from Texas A&M University. He is the founder and CEO of CIS - Computer Innovation Services Inc., a software solutions and consulting organization. CIS, founded in 1997, now services customers worldwide with its software and technology solutions.

For over 25 years, Ken has specialized in the creation and implementation of supply-chain logistics software and solutions. In 2008, CIS was awarded the Aggie 100 designation as one of the top 100 Aggie-owned businesses for the prior year (ranked #15). That same year, he was also awarded the Alpha Phi Alpha Entrepreneur of the Year Award.

Ken has shown his dedication to the Aggie Network through his service as founder, chair, and board member of the Black Former Student Network, and as a past board member of the Greek Former Student Network. Prior to serving on The Association of Former Students' Board of Directors, he served as a Representative at Large. He has also served as a member of the Texas A&M University Aggie Spirit Development Council, the Texas A&M University Department of Computer Science Strategic Development Committee, Nu Pi Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. and the DFW Society Young Executives Club.

An Endowed Century Club member, Ken and his wife, Ann-Marie, have six children, including Kenya, Class of 2020.
